The Cariño Mariñeiro initiative aims to enhance the value of our maritime heritage. Local people and visitors can explore the seafaring history of Cariño via several self-guided routes that showcase its marine trades, workplaces, and landscapes.

These town and coastal routes can be completed on foot or by mountain bike. They are suitable for all abilities

The municipalities of Cedeira, Cariño, Cerdido, Moeche, Ortiqueira, San Sadurniño and Valdoviño are currently promoting the region as a UNESCO World Geopark candidate. The area that you are about to discover is the result of a major geological event know as the Variscan Orogeny, which took place 350 million years ago. There are 108 Places of Geological Interest in the region, 6 of them of international relevance.

### CARIÑO – SAN XIAO DO TREBO – CAPE ORTEGAL

Starting in Cariño town centre, this linear route follows the coast and offers some magnificent scenic views. The walk takes you through the old part of Cariño and then on to the Camino Viejo de San Xiao, a pathway which runs through a beautiful stretch of gallery forest. This leads to the chapel of San Xiao de Trebo, where the route then connects with a trail leading directly to Cabo Ortegal and the Os Aquillóns rocky islets.

### A MALVEIRA VP – VÍXIA DA HERBEIRA / A MIRANDA VP

This linear route begins at the A Malveira viewpoint and runs through the Sierra de A Capelada. There are two possible end points that you can choose for your walk. One end point is the Vixia da Herbeira viewpoint, which offers a breathtaking view of the highest cliffs in continental Europe. The other end point is the A Miranda viewpoint, from which you have a spectacular view of the Ortigueira estuary, a real environmental gem of the area.

- Oistance: 11 km (Vixía da Herbeira) / 12 km (A Miranda)
- Terrain: Difficult
- Time: 3 hours (Vixía da Herbeira) / 3.5 hours (A Miranda)
- Start point: A Malveira VP
- End point: Vixía da Herbeira VP / A Miranda VP

## CARIÑO -FIGUEIROA

This circular route starts from Cariño town centre and goes around Monte Mazanteo. Each of its slopes offers fantastic scenic views: the Ortigueira estuary with the island of San Vicente to the south and southeast; and the town of Cariño with the peaks of Faroleiro and Gargacido to the north. You also have the possibility to visit Fornos beach or Punta do Frade on this route.

- Distance: 9 km
- Time: 1.5 hours
- Start and end point: Cariño Town Hall

# PRESERVING MEMORIES

Enjoy a **circular walk** through the old part of Cariño, a town adapted to its unique landscape which reflects a life that has always revolved around the sea. On this route you can see some distinctive maritime architecture, visit local viewpoints, and learn about the history of the town's canning and fishing industry.

- Distance: 6.5 km
- Time: 2 hours
- Start and end point: Cariño Town Hall

# MADERA DE MARINEROS

The main feature of this circular route is the coastline of the parishes of Feás. Landoi and Sismundi. Highlights include learning about some traditional local trades, such as shoreline boat-building and shellfish extraction, the old piers used to transport passengers to Ortiqueira, and the apple orchards of Ollo Landoi. The route also offers an incredible view of part of the Ortiqueira estuary. This environmental jewel is part of the Natura 2000 Network of protected areas and has been designated as a wetland of international importance under the Ramsar Convention.

Distance: 10 km

Time: 3 hours

Start and end point: Hotel Pedramea car park
